

PHRASAL VERBS



Phrasal verbs are words made up of a base verb and one or more particles. These particles change the meaning of the verb in different ways.

Turn off

means to stop the operation of something, like turning off a light.

Look after

means to take care of someone or something, like looking after a child or a pet.

Pick up

can mean to lift something or to collect someone, like picking up a package or picking up a friend from the airport.

Put away

means to put something in its proper place, like putting away dishes after a meal.

Get on

can mean to board a vehicle or to have a good relationship with someone, like getting on a bus or getting on well with a friend.

It's important to note that phrasal verbs often have multiple meanings, so it's essential to understand the context in which they are used.
