

Lesson Plans

BODY PARTS

Lesson Title: "My Body, Myself"

Objective: The objective of this lesson is to introduce basic body parts in English. (head, shoulders, knees, toes, eyes, ears, mouth and nose)

Materials:

Pictures or flashcards of body parts

White Construction Paper - 1-metre piece for each student

Markers

A stuffed animal or puppet

Lesson:

- Begin the lesson by introducing the topic of body parts to the students. Ask them if they can name any of the body parts.
- Show the flashcards to introduce the vocabulary. Ask the students to repeat the names of the body parts.
- If you have a puppet or doll repeat the body parts pointing to each one as you name them.
- Play a game of "Simon Says" using different body parts as commands. For example, "Simon says touch your head" or "Simon says point to your nose."
- Play the song "Head, Shoulders, Knees, and Toes" and encourage the students to sing along and touch each body part as it is mentioned in the song.
- Place the construction paper on the floor and ask each student, in turn, to lie on a piece of paper. Draw the outline of each student's body. Then let the students draw the eyes, ears, nose, mouth, knees, toes, and shoulders.
- Hang all the papers on the wall and review the body parts by saying, "Suzie has two eyes." "Tom has one nose." Etc.

Closing Activities

Sequencing using body parts.

Talk about each picture - How many eyes can you see? How many toes can you see?
