Spelling of verbs in the 'third person'

In general we add 's' to the end of a verb.

I speak English every day. = He speaks English every day.

Verbs ending with 'o' - 'ch' - 'sh' - 's' - 'x' - 'z'

For verbs ending in one of the above, we add 'es' to the verb.

You always catch the ball. = It always catches the ball.

Verbs ending with a consonant & 'y', remove the 'y' and add 'ies'

For verbs ending in 'y' and before the 'y' there is a consonant, take off the 'y' and add 'ies' to the verb.

We study Spanish on Mondays. = She studies Spanish on Mondays.

Present Simple - Get Home!

How to play

You will need counters.

- The first page is the board, pages 2, 3 and 4 are the cards.
- Cut, shuffle and place the cards face down, in a pile.
- Place the board in the middle of the players.
- This can be played with two or four players.
- Each player or pair of players places their green or blue counters on the 'School' circles.
- The first player picks up a card and moves onto the blue or green circle on the board with the word 'start' and then moves along the board to the first square with the ending on the card. For example the blue player picks up an 's', he moves to the square with 'ask'. He then says a sentence using the verb 'ask', depending on the Pronoun and whether it is a positive sentence, negative sentence or question. E.g. - Positive Sentence - "He always **asks** me the same question."
- Play carries on and the players go round the board till they get back to the square just before the 'start' circle. Then they go up their colour path till one player gets both his counters home. The player that gets both his counters 'Home' first is the winner.

Important:

- If when moving around the board a player lands on an opponent standing on the same square the opponent has to start from the beginning.
- When standing on one of the coloured squares to get home. If a player turns over a card with one of the endings that are on a coloured square he moves forward to that square. If the player turns over a card without one of the endings - he jumps straight home.
- A player can have both counters moving around the board at the same time.
- The cards are divided into different pronouns and also positive sentences, negative sentences and questions.
