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Turn Over – Regular and Stative Verbs

How to play:

This can be played with 2 to 6 players. Divide the players into two groups; the 'green' group and the 'blue group'. Give each group coloured counters (you will probably need 25 of each colour).

Before the game starts, shuffle the 'Regular Verb' and 'Stative Verb' cards and then place them face up on the table in 6 rows of six cards, e.g. 6x6. This is called the 'board'.

Shuffle the 'verb' cards and place them in a pile on the table.

The first player picks up a 'verb' card, for example: the verb 'love'. The player names the card and places the card on one of the 'Stative Verb' cards on the table. The player then places one of his/her coloured counters on the 'verb' card and says a sentence, "My sister loves ice cream."

A player from the next group picks a card, for example, the verb '**help**'. If group no.2 can place their 'verb' card next to group no.1's 'verb' card, they place their counter on their card and then they can replace group no.1's counter with one of their own. The player says a sentence, "I am helping my mum in the kitchen." This means that group no.2 has two counters on the 'board'.

If group no.2 can't place their verb card next to group no.1's card, they place the card anywhere on the board, place their counter on the card and say a sentence.

The game ends when the board is covered with the verb cards and the counters. The group with the most counters on the 'board' is the winner.
