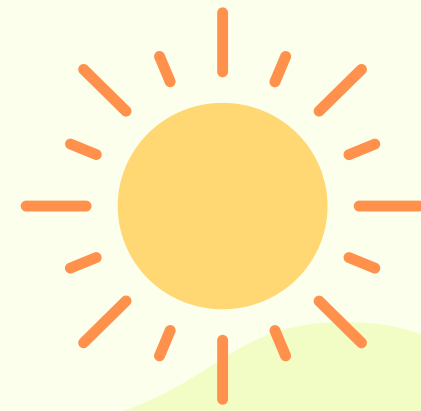


PAST SIMPLE IRREGULAR VERBS



Rhyming Pairs & Word Families

- Introduce two irregular verbs with the same word family past forms. For example, "write" (wrote) and "drive" (drove).
- Create a short sentence using both verbs in the past simple tense. This could be a silly sentence to grab their attention, for instance, "Yesterday, the spider wrote a note and drove to school."
- Encourage students to repeat the sentence, focusing on the word family or rhyming verb forms. You can even act out the sentence for added engagement.
- Challenge students to come up with their own rhyming pairs and sentences. This will help them actively engage with the verbs and make them more memorable.

Additional Tips for Daily Implementation:

- Rotate verb pairs daily to keep things fresh and cover a broader range of verbs over time.
- Integrate these word families or rhyming pairs into other activities like short quizzes, games, or songs to reinforce learning.
