Pubs in England

Pubs are an essential part of English life. People do many things at the pub. They meet friends, eat pub meals, play darts, listen to music, drink a pint or two and relax after a long days work or just hang out there on a Sunday afternoon.

Pubs often have two bars: 'The quiet bar' a smaller area or room where you can meet and chat with your friends and the 'main bar' which is rowdier. You can listen to music on the jukebox or play a round of darts while having a drink.

Many pubs have gardens where people can sit in the hotter months. Children are allowed to go to the pub and sit in the pub gardens with their parents.

3 When groups of friends get together they normally buy 'rounds' of drinks, this is when each friend has a turn to buy the drinks for all the other friends in the group.

Pubs sell soft drinks as well as alcoholic drinks (in pints not litres) and they serve really good food too. A typical pub lunch can consist of Fish and Chips, Shepherd's Pie or a baked potato with butter and melted cheese.

Pubs have really nice traditional names, some of which are 600 years old.

Some typical names are The White Swan, The Crown, The King's Arms and The Red Lion. All pubs have signs that go with their names. The one below is called the 'Cat & Fiddle'.
