4 in a Row – Past Progressive Game

How to play:

You will need counters. There are four boards and 24 cards.

Cut the cards up.

Each student receives a board.

Place the verb cards in a pile and the time expression cards in a pile.

Each student in turn, picks up a verb card and a time expression cards and says a sentence using the two cards.

For example: I was **writing a letter** at **4pm yesterday**.

The student with 'write a letter' and '4pm yesterday' on his/her board covers the square, where the two meet, with a counter.

It is then the next student's turn.

Other examples:

My mum was **washing the dishes** while I was playing outside.

My sisters were **doing homework** when my mum came home.

The winner is the first student to place 4 counters in a row on his/her board.
