The song is about a sixteen-year-old girl who the singer has fallen in love with.

The singer is addressing the sixteen-year-old girl he has fallen in love with.

The singer describes the person he is singing to as having lips like strawberry wine, sparkling eyes, ribbons and curls, and being beautiful.

The singer fell in love with the person he is singing to on the night they met.

The singer could not stop kissing the person he is singing to.

The phrase "You're my baby, you're my pet" means that the singer sees the person he is singing to as someone he cares for deeply and wants to protect.

It's unclear why the singer says "I shouldn't love you, but I do" at the end of the song.

Yes, the last two lines ("What shall we do with a drunken sailor? / What shall we do with a drunken sailor?") don't belong to this song.
